

DROP OFF TRASH, FREE!

Calcasieu Parish has two disposal sites—Residential Solid Waste Convenience Centers—where parish residents can drop off large or irregular items for free with a valid driver's license. Certain recyclable items are also accepted.

DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

An attendant will be present during all open hours to direct you. When you arrive at the collection site, stop at the attendant's booth and have your driver's license scanned.

Motors, tanks and cans must be drained

Animal carcasses must be double-bagged

White goods must be freon-free and doors must be


